



Weingut Jordan – Wines That Leave a Lasting Impression

Elegance, Terroir and Family Tradition Since 1858

Wineries are not created overnight – they are shaped by generations into what they are today. Since 1858, knowledge about wine has been developed at Weingut Jordan in Groß-Reipersdorf near Pulkau and carefully passed down from one generation to the next. Inspired by this tradition, Simone Hiller-Jordan and her husband Hannes now manage the modern family winery in the beautiful Weinviertel region in its fourth generation, supported by Simone's parents Anni and Karl Jordan.

Terroir with Character

The foundation for the long-lived Jordan wines is clearly the soil of their homeland. In the white wine-dominated Weinviertel, the Pulkau vineyards – particularly the Ried Haselparz – form a red wine island. The soils of ancient rock and loess, combined with the harsh Waldviertel wind and the Pannonian climate of the Weinviertel, provide ideal conditions for expressive wines.

Diversity from Conviction

The affinity for red wine is reflected in the intensive work with the traditional Austrian varieties Zweigelt and St. Laurent. However, the winery also impresses with an impressive range of Grüner Veltliners – from classically peppery to single-vineyard wines from ancient rock to "SteinZeit", which matures for 12 months in a granite cask and shows pure finesse with its minerality.

Sparkling Excellence: A Success Story in Bubbles

A particular source of pride for the winery are the winegrower Sekts produced using traditional bottle fermentation. The Grüner Veltliner Brut Reserve was awarded 92 points in the Falstaff Sparkling Special and GOLD at the Glass of Bubbly Awards in London. The Riesling Brut Große Reserve received 93+ points in A la Carte and impresses with fine mousse and mineral elegance. The Blanc de Noir Brut Reserve completes the award-winning Sekt trio with GOLD in London.

In May 2025, Jordan's Sekts were selected among the best winegrower Sekts in Lower Austria: Grüner Veltliner Brut Reserve and Riesling Brut Große Reserve both made it into the Top 5. The portfolio also includes Orange Wines, premium distillates, and culinary specialties.

Philosophy: Capturing Nature

For Simone and Hannes Hiller-Jordan, being winemakers means capturing the fascination of nature, being sensitive to how the year develops, and bringing the best qualities that nature allows into the cellar. It is a conviction to never stand still on the same insights, but to continue developing – with both feet on the ground and eyes on the future.

Awards and Recognition

The consistent quality work is regularly rewarded: The winery has received three Falstaff stars, numerous gold medals at international competitions (Glass of Bubbly Awards London, Berlin Wine Trophy, Mundus Vini), and outstanding ratings in specialist magazines such as A la Carte, Gault & Millau, Vinaria, and The Drinks Business. Particularly noteworthy: In 2020, the Zweigelt Rubin Reserve was named "Best Austrian Red Wine" at the International Wine Award Mundus Vini.

Tastings and Events

Tastings take place Monday to Saturday from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm by appointment. The winery regularly participates in renowned events such as ProWein, Weintour Weinviertel, and its own events such as "Feuer & Flamme für Sekt" (Fire & Flame for Sekt).

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
